Sir:-

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 28th ultimo in which you made report relative to trips which you made to the Temagami district to attend Indians during illness; and in reply I beg to submit herewith blank forms of account on which you may render your account in duplicate for the attendance in question, after which you should submit it to the Department when the question of payment will be considered.

Your attention is drawn to the fact that the Department allows a mileage rate of .50¢ one way for the distance covered by a physician who attends Indians if he travels with a horse and vehicle. You will observe that it is stated on the face of the form that when journeys are made by rail, first class return fare may be charged. Your particular attention is drawn to the regulations printed in red on the medical account form.
