MR.BROWN: It simply means you have no jurisdiction over water et all passing through Indian Reserves.

THE CHAIRMAN: We have some jurisdiction, not complete juris-

MR.BROWN: What 1s 1t?

THE CHAIR MAN: I need not explain the whole thing to you, I am not your lawyer. I am merely telling you this for your advantage that you may be able to get the water.

MR. BROWN: You have apparently 200 acres on Number 10B.

MR.BALLS: No, the irrigable land is estimated at 33 acres.

THE CHAIRMAN: You have to go in the Indian Reserve to get to your property, do you?

MR.BROWN: The land is on the other side of a very steep hill so we are bound to. I don't think it is possible to get around otherwise. It is for the benefit of the quuntry to allow water to go down to 2466.

MR.BALLS: The next is Lower Similkameen, Number 11. Ashnola
