no difference; He will say, 'Enter thou into the joy of thy Lord.' It is true we made fun of 'Christians, and mocked at prayer and sneered at faith; but that is not much to be afraid of. It is true when the Holy Spirit pleaded with us a year or six months ago to confess Christ in public we told Him to leave us; we were ashamed to do it in the presence of men, to confess Him who spread out His arms on a cross of bitterest agony for us; but for all that we feel sure that when we march up to the judgment seat of Christ He will treat us just the same as He treats the disciples who have laid down their lives for the Master.
