HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion kands in Manufest and the Worth west Territories, excepting 8 and 10 will be the Manufest and the Worth west to the Manufest and the Manuf

Entry may be made personally at the local and office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the district is which the land is a "stude; receive the district in which the land is a "stude; received by for some one or made cutry for him. HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans:—

At least six months' residence upon and ultivation of the land in each year during the erm of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is oligible to make a consistent of the consistent of the consistent Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to re-stantistic by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homostead, or a certificate for the issue of seriled by this Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act acto residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant o indicate the same township or an adjoining r cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent the settler must give six months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.
