ST. MARTINS, N.B.-Next spring improvements will be made to the St. Martins Railway, for which purpose ties will be taken out this winter.

MIDLAND, UNT.—A report has been submitted to the county council re-commending the construction of a steel bridge over the Sturgeon River on second concession of Oro.

DUNDALK, ONT. -T. L. Hanbury, village clerk, desires offers by December 25th for \$20,000 debentures, being \$6,000 for streets and sidewalks, \$6,000 for town hall and \$8,000 for waterworks.

BROMPTON FALLS, QUE.—At a meeting of the directors of the Brompton Paper & Pulp Company, held last week, arrangements were completed for the erection of a large paper mill next spring.
