CAUGHT SMUGGLING WHEAT.

He was indicted about a year ago by the United States Courts for the same offence, but when the officers tried to effect arrest, their man stepped over the border into Manitoba and pelted the defeated American officers with clods of earth. The agents bided their time, and succeeded finally in catching their man in Uncle Sam's domain.

THE MAPLES HOLSTEINS.

The Maples Dairy Farm, the property of Walburn Rivers, Falden's, Ont., is noted as the home of one of the choicest herds of Record-of-Merit Holsteins in the far-famed dairy county of Oxford. From Ingersoll, the farm is five miles distant; from Woodstock, about eight, with telephone connection from both. This splendid herd is now 26 strong, with all the females in milk, excepting two two-year-old heifers, in the Record of Merit. The younger things include several young bulls, the get of the stock bull, Lord Wayne Mechthilde Calamity, whose sire's dam's three-year-old butter record is 18 lbs. in seven days, his dam's two-year-old record is 12 lbs., and her dam's is 22 lbs. in seven days, respectively. As indicating the high-class character of the herd, we give below the seven-day butter records of a few of them, estimated on an 80-per-cent. basis, and all official: Countess Daisy Clay, 15 lbs. as a three-year-old, 64 lbs. of milk in 1 day; this cow has given 60 lbs. of milk a day 7 months after freshening. Out of her is a splendid ten-months-old bull, by the stock bull, Princess Calamity Wayne, 18 lbs. butter and 65 lbs. milk as a four-year-old; Tolona Albino Wayne, 11 lbs. as a two-year-old; Daisy De Kol Wayne, 10 lbs. at two years 6 months after freshening; Calamity Posch Wayne, 10 lbs. at 22 months of age, four months after freshening; Duchess Christmas Gift, 13 lbs. at two years, butter-fat test 4 per cent.; Daisy Wayne De Kol, 124 lbs. at two years, also tested 4 per cent.; Daisy Albino De Kol Duchess, 15 lbs. at three years; this cow has a ten-months-old bull calf, by stock bull, Princess Calamity Clay, 20 lbs. as a four-year-old; Daisy Albino De Kol, 19 lbs. at four years; Daisy Nightingale of Norval, 19 lbs. at five years; Princess Calamity Posch, 12 lbs. at two years. There are several others with records that average about the same. Of the two-year-old heifers that have not been tested, one is for sale. She is a daughter of Abalakirk Tryntje De Kol, whose record is 15 lbs. butter as a three-year-old, and 65 lbs. milk; this heifer is something extra, put up on show lines, and carries a well-balanced udder. Also for sale is her heifer calf, sired by King Posch De Kol, whose dam's record is 21 lbs. Besides the bulls mentioned, there is a yearling, out of Abalakirk Schilling, whose milk record is 65 lbs. a day at four years. Another yearling one is out of Tolona Duchess De Kol, whose record is 15 lbs. butter in seven days. There are also several young girls, one of which is a stock bull, a heifer, and a cow, all of which need but a few words to describe. They are all well bred, and their udders are of the best.
