Yeas 10 Nays 5

And there being a majority in the affirmative.

ORDERED, That the faid Address and the faid Memorial be ingrossed, and figned by Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Bedard moved, feconded by Mr. Tafchereau,

That the following Address be presented to His Honor the President, praying he will be pleased to transmit to the foot of the throne, the said Address and Petition, and the said Memoral.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR HONOUR,

We His Majesty's Dutiful and Loyal Subjects the Representatives of Lower-Canada, take the liberty of foliciting Your Honor upon a Subject of the utmost confequence to this part of His Majesty's Dominions.

Having been informed, that the Merchants of this Country have adopted means to obtain His Majefty's difallowance of the Act paffed in the laft Seffion of the Provincial Parliament, initialed, "An Act for the e-" rection of a Common Goal in each of the Diffricts of Quebee and Mon-" treal refpectively ; and the means for defraying the Expences thereof," We have conceived it incumbent upon us, humbly to fubmit to His Majefty, the motives which induced the Affembly to adopt the mode of taxation contained in the faid Act, and to expose to His Majefty by humble address and petition our prayers, that he may graciously be pleafed to accept the inpply offered to him by that Act and not give theireto his Royal difallowance.

The attention of Your Honour to the interests of the Empire and of this Colony, and Your good will towards us, give us reason to hope You will acquiesce in our present request, That You will be pleased to transmit to the Foot of the Throne, an humble petition to His Majesty and
