PREMIER BORDEN ARRIVES SAFELY

Sir Robert and Party Reach England for Imperial Conference

Ottawa, Feb. 22.—Sir Robert Borden and party have arrived safely in England, a cablegram to the Government announced yesterday.

In the premier's party were Hon. J. D. Hazen, minister of marine and naval affairs; Hon. Robert Rogers, minister of public works; L. C. Christie, confidential secretary to the premier; and Herbert Cole, private secretary to Sir George Perley, overseas minister of militia.

The Canadian ministers are in England to attend the imperial conference called by Premier Lloyd George.

Reference in a London press cable to a postponement of the conference is puzzling officials here, who have had no intimation of any such action. It is pointed out that no date has ever been set for the conference for the reason that it would depend upon the length of time that it would require for the overseas delegates to reach England.

It is assumed here that what is meant by postponement is a possible departure delaying the delegation's departure. Mid-March would be the earliest possible date now, as it requires three weeks to make the Australian trip.

U OF T. REPORT.

Toronto, Feb. 21.—The annual report of the University of Toronto submitted to the legislature by the provincial secretary shows a revenue for the past year of \$358,870 and expenses of \$912,359. With the accumulated deficit from the previous year, the balance is on the wrong side by over \$79,000, which has been met by special grants of \$80,000 by legislature. There was a heavy decline in the receipts from students' fees and this decline is expected to be still greater this year owing to the continued enlistment.

CHECK NOT HONORED.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$300 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent also 90 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead tent on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$300 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 90 acres and erect a house worth \$200. W. W. CODY, Deputy Minister of the Interior.
