It takes thirty-three cents to send a one-pound parcel from Canada to the trenches in France. The government gets only eight cents for landing it in England, and it costs twenty-five cents to carry each parcel from England to the front. There may be no profit in the haul, but it looks high, even when war-time risks are considered.

Barrieffield camp will open on May 15th. This is the first definite information that has been received. Only Overseas troops will be stationed there besides the P.A.S.C., which will of course look after the supplies. The name of the commandment of the camp has not yet been made public. It is expected that the 38th Battalion now stationed at Ottawa will be moved there.

The activities of the Good Roads men are attracting some attention. The process of converting a rocky dirt road into a macadamized one is interesting and the results obtained by the use of grader and roller are so satisfactory and the time made so good that in a very short while Athens will have a first class main thoroughfare. The roads are being made 12 feet wide but the wide part of Main street will be 24 feet.

DOMINION NEWS A forest fire is devastating a fine timber region in Eagle River valley, near Craigellachie, B. C. Ald. Neil Cooper of London, Ont., who has been in the council almost continuously since 1896, died at the age of 60 years. Mrs Frank Goodwin of Sarua escaped from her nurse in the early morning, and was later found killed by a train on the bay shore. George Jerrold Potts, M. D., M. R. C. S., formerly editor of The Leader and surgeon with British and American forces, died at Clinton in his 80th year. By the Speaker's casting vote in the Assembly Halifax was not placed under the Provincial prohibitory law which is in force over the rest of Nova Scotia. Peterboro Medical Society has completed details of organization of a base hospital unit for the front, the city furnishing a complete staff, and maintenance on service. Denial has been received at Ottawa of the reported death at the front of Miss Percy Richardson, a nurse with the first contingent; also of that of Col. Meighen of Montreal.
