"BLACK HAND" MURDER.

An Italian From Toronto Kills a Man For Giving Up Secrets of Society in New York.

New York, Aug. 25.—Salvatore Bossito, eighteen years old, was shot to death in his father's restaurant on Park street by Carlo Rossati, 35 years old, early yesterday, because he had disclosed to the police the secrets of the alleged "Blacks" Hand." The father was knocked down and choked into insensibility by the slayer, who then ran down the street followed by a great mob.

After his arrival he was seen about Mulberry Bend with Italians, and because of his immense stature attracted attention.

attracted attention. Bossito is an enemy of these organized gangs, and his son inherited the enmity.

At the police station Rossati said little beyond declaring he shot in

Toronto, Aug. 25.—A prominent Italian was asked yesterday whether he knew a Carlo Rossati who had been in Toronto lately. After conbeen in Toronto lately. After considerable hesitation, he said he did. "He is a very hamdsome man, tall, with broad shoulders," he added, "and dressed very showily. He was

very energetic in talking with the Ltvery effergetic in talking with the Halians around the city, and on two or three occasions he had large numbers of sympathizers with him on street corners, where he was haranguing them. He could talk very weil, if the snatches of the conversation I heard were fair samples. He proposed to form a society for the protection of the Italians of this city from heing down-trodden, as he described being down-trodden, as he described it, and, if an Italian does get into trouble, to see that he is properly defended."

"Was he successful in his attempt to form the society?"

"I do not know. However, I believe this man was here to form an agency of the "Black Hand," a society whose kidnappings and black-mailings in New York and the larger cities of the United States have given the police much trouble."

"Baltimore, I believe. He was only here about three weeks and I have act seen him for the last couple of days, so it is possible that he has
