Execution of Goolds For Trunk Murder.

Monte Carlo, Oct. 21.—The trial of the Goolds, husband and wife, for the murder of Mrs. Levin, a Swedish acquaintance, will begin ten days hence. "It is well understood here, however, that neither of them will suffer the death penalty. An execution could not take place here," said a high official at the Casino, to a correspondent. "Such a thing is not to be thought of. It would seriously affect the Riviera season, and they would not tolerate such an unpleasant thing at Nice for the same reason. STEP FOR HOME CONTROL.

Lemieux's Trip to Japan Assertion of Canada's National Rights.

London, Oct. 22.—The Morning Post says the significance of Lemieux's change of plans ought not to be ignored. Instead of going to Japan as Canadian envoy of the Imperial Government, he goes as Imperial envoy of the Canadian Government. Considering all the circumstances his mission seems to mark another step in the development of the demand put forward by the present Canadian Government for power to control negotiation treaties exclusively or principally affecting Canada.

Whether the experiment succeeds or fails it can hardly fail to have a marked influence upon the future course of Imperial evolution. Already it appears His Majesty may be represented at foreign capitals by an envoy of his Government in Canada as well as by an envoy of the Government at Westminster.

Fatal Elevator Accident.

London, Oct. 22.—Charles Doyle was killed and William Patrick is dying as the result of an accident in the International Harvester Co.'s warehouse shortly after six o'clock last evening.

Doyle and Patrick, in company with a man named Turville, were descending in the elevator. A board left lying across the opening at one floor stopped the elevator and the cable continued to unwind.

Turville stopped off to ascertain the cause of the stop and at the same instant the board broke and the elevator dropped, carrying both men, as they fell, twenty feet.

Both were removed to Victoria Hospital. Doyle died at 9.15. At a late hour last night no hope was held out for Patrick.
