

cattle which had arrived by the steamship "Oregon," "Lake Nepean," and "Anjer-Head," all these cattle having been placed by the inspector in the same category, and while the result would have been the placing of Canada on the scheduled list. The parties interested in the trade had obtained the presence of Professor Williams, the president of the Veterinary College at Edinburgh; Mr. W. R. Reynolds, the veterinary surgeon of the Liverpool Corporation; Mr. W. B. Baines, veterinary surgeon, Liverpool; Mr. J. Lewis, veterinary surgeon, of Crews; Mr. Joseph Wellby, V. S. Liverpool, and Mr. Wells, V. S. After Sir Charles Tupper had delivered his letter to Professor Duguid, this gentleman proceeded with him to the Canadian cattle lairage, where they met the owner and Mr. Montgomery, of the Dominion Steamship Company, and other parties interested in the cattle trade. Mr. Montgomery demanded that six of the cases, which the local inspector conceived to be the worst, should be selected for slaughter and examined. This demand was met by a prompt refusal, on the ground that the matter had already been decided. Sir Charles here made himself understood, and he received from the Privy Council, that this request should be complied with. The selection was then made, and a careful post mortem examination made, the result of which showed that the local inspector and Professor Duguid had made a very serious mistake in the matter, the animals not being infected either with Texas or splenic fever. Their temperatures were ascertained and found to be normal, the examination of the blood by the microscope was entirely satisfactory, the weight and condition of the spleen, and the condition of the fourth stomach and the intestines all indicated that the cattle were entirely free from Texas fever. Mr. Moore and Professor Duguid acknowledged their mistake, but stated that they were unable to release the cattle from the embargo, hereby placed upon them in consequence of their previous communication to the Privy Council, but that they would report promptly to the Secretary the result of the inspection. Sir Charles immediately afterwards returned to London, arriving at midnight, and on the morning of the 29th he had an interview with Mr. Peel at the Privy Council office, who, after a full discussion of the whole question, stated that he was exceedingly glad that Sir Charles had been able to get to Liverpool, and that an order would be immediately made for the prompt release of all Canadian cattle. This was an outline of what has been an exceedingly interesting and important matter of investigation, and it is gratifying to be able to report that the result has been not only to remove the imputation of disease from Canadian cattle, but as is believed, to confound to much greater caution on the part of the officials in dealing with a question so important to our interests in the future. The following is the certificate of the veterinary inspection:—

Liverpool, August 29—We, the undersigned veterinary surgeons, fellows or members of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, hereby certify that we have examined the undermentioned lot of Canadian cattle:—
1st, a lot in the Canada Laire, Huskisson Dock, Liverpool, and stated to be covered by the No. 4 "Ontario" and 2nd, a lot in the No. 4 shed, Wallasey Laire, ex "Lake Nepean." About fifty of the said cattle were inspected by us, after slaughter, and these, as well as the remaining animals, were found to be free from contagious disease. We observed that a few of the cattle presented symptoms of disease on the digestive organs, manifested by slightly bloated stomachs, and a slight elevation of temperature; these were in our opinion, due to the system of feeding and the sea voyage.
