





THE Department of Public Works of Can-ada, being about to resume operations for the improvement of the Channel at the Horse Shoe Shoal, at the entrance to the Miramichi River, will from this date have the

Dredge "St. Lawrence"

Dreage "St. Lawrence" engaged in performing the dredging required and the said dredge will have a number of anchors, lines, and cables for mooring pur-poses deposited in the Channel and on the flats on either side of the Channel, all ot which when put down will be buoyed. All masters of Steamers are cautioned to keep clear of said buoys, lines and cables, se as to prevent their being taken up and fouled in the paddles or propellors—as the above mentioned moorings will be in place whe ther the dredge is there or not.
