A New Cathedral to be Erected in Pekin. The recent success of the Chinese government in obtaining the consent of the Papal authorities for the removal of the old Catholic cathedral in Pekin to a position in the northwest corner of the imperial palace grounds recalls the interesting history of the edifice and of the many attempts made by successive emperors to secure its removal.

Palace of the Emperors. At daybreak on September 21st of the year 63, before Christ, Augustus was born on the Palatine Hill, in a modest house opening on a lane toward the Capitoline Hill, which led from the valley, where now the Coliseum stands, up the slopes of the hill toward the modern church and convent of St. Bonaventura.

The Church in Switzerland. The death of Archbishop Lachat, Apostolic Administrator of the Canton Ticino, is threatening to revive serious religious feud in Switzerland. The population of the Italian Canton is altogether Catholic, but in no part of the Helvetic Republic are the free-thinking Radicals, especially in Bellinzona and Lugano, so violent in their opposition to the Church. They have now seized the opportunity of Mgr. Lachat's death to agitate for the joining of Ticino to one of the German-speaking Swiss dioceses, which both distasteful to the Italian speaking population and likely to lead to difficulties and unpleasantness.

European Currency. The United States paper currency is the most artistic in appearance and convenient in size and form. The Bank of England note is printed on Irish linen water-limed paper, plain white, and with ragged edges.

The Number in Heaven. Rev. Dr. Bernard O'Reilly, who for many years was a valued contributor to the press is the author of "Novissima; or Where do our Departed Go?" The question embodied in the title is answered only as regards overruling rewards; the subject will be treated in a subsequent volume.

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The work of Augustus was continued by his successor and Theodosius. It is impossible to give a description of this immense and complicated mass of buildings. One must be on the spot and examine those endless streets of apartments, halls, to racers, crypts and cellars composed of the difficulty of the problem. Every emperor has enlarged, altered, destroyed and reconstructed the works of his predecessors. One section of the imperial palace buildings has remained unaltered, the first section built by Augustus across the center of the hill. The state entrance to this portion of the building was approached from the east by a wide street named Apollo, from the sanctuary to which it led.

On the top of the central arch Augustus placed the masterpiece of Lysias, a chariot drawn by four horses and led by Apollo and Diana, the whole group being cut out of a single block of marble. A sculptor and an antiquarian of the time of Sixtus V., who has left a diary of discoveries which took place in his lifetime, says "I recollect to have seen in the palace of the Cæsars the remains of a colossal gate, with posts of Greek marble, twenty-nine feet high and wide, and a niche of African marble on the top of it. Once across the threshold of those propylæe, the visitor stood before a group which contemporary writers have rightly called 'golden perfection' and chef d'œuvre of magnificence." Surrounding the sacred area stood fifty statues of the Dioscuri and a statue of their prolific father.

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
