NEWFOUNDLAND PATRIOTIC AS-  
SOCIATION EMPLOYMENT  
COMMITTEE.

The Employment Committee has  
been appointed by the Newfoundland  
Patriotic Association "to take into  
consideration applications for employ-  
ment in civil life from returned Sold-  
iers and Sailors of the Newfoundland  
Regiment and Newfoundland Royal  
Naval Reserve who have been granted  
honourable discharges." The Com-  
mittee can only perform this duty to  
our returned soldiers and sailors with  
the fullest help and co-operation of  
all those in the Colony who employ  
labour or require help or service of  
any kind in which these men may be  
employed. The Committee will pre-  
pare and keep on file a register of all  
men seeking employment, giving their  
age, qualifications and experience, so  
far as possible, of each applicant.  
This information will be available to  
prospective employers, and steps will  
be taken to bring about interviews  
or correspondence between employers  
and soldier or sailor applicants. Ev-  
ery person or firm when requiring  
such help for either domestic or busi-  
ness purposes is therefore invited to  
communicate to the Committee the  
nature of the help required, and of  
the work to be done, and such other  
information as may be useful.

of the Committee are at the Colonial  
Building, St. John's, and communi-  
cations should be addressed to A. E.  
Parsons, Secretary of the Employment  
Committee.
