BOXING AND WRESTLING—LAST NIGHT'S BOUTS.

The preliminary bouts in connection with the boxing and wrestling championships, took place in the Prince's Rink last night before a large attendance of spectators. The various competitors weighed in at 7 o'clock, all making the required weight with the exception of Brockiehurst, in the Bantam Class, while Raines, of the Lightweight Class, was not allowed to participate by the medical examiner, due to an injury to his thumb.

As a result of the ruling, only one preliminary bout was staged instead of three, as anticipated. However, the night's performance was not marred any as two good exhibitions of both boxing and wrestling followed in its stead. The one and only preliminary contest staged was the boxing in the flyweight class between James (112 lbs.) and L. English (110½ lbs.). Both lads rushed matters from the very outset, and slugged each other unmercifully. James, who was slightly superior, landed several telling blows which quickly weakened his man, and inside of one minute he had English down for a count of seven. After this James just waited an opportunity and getting the desired opening, floored his opponent with a body blow, taking the count of ten.

An exhibition bout followed between C. La Fosse (113 lbs.) and J. Pihlan (103 lbs.). This exhibition was lively throughout and greatly enjoyed by the fans. The next was an exhibition of wrestling between A. Hennebury, the lightweight champion, and Adams, welterweight champion. Ten minutes the crowd was treated to an excellent exhibition of mat work, the result ending in a draw.

The main attraction takes place in the ring to-morrow night, the full programme of which will appear in to-morrow's issue.

INTER-CLUB BILLIARD TOURNAMENT.

Two very interesting games in the Inter-Club Billiard Tournament, were played at the Masonic rooms last night, resulting in the Masonic players gaining both by substantial margins and reducing the B. I. S. lead by 200 points. The first game Snow (Masonic) vs. O'Neill (B.I.S.) was a good exhibition. At the B.I.S. rooms Selwyn played O'Neill, but as Mr. Selwyn is out of town, Mr. Snow replaced him.

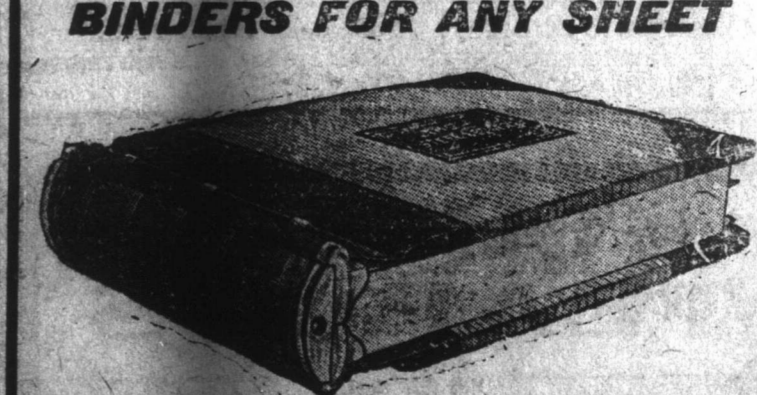
