

BOXING AND WRESTLING LAST NIGHT'S BOUTS.

However, the night's performance was not marred any as two good exhibitions of both boxing and wrestling followed in its stead. The one and only preliminary contest staged was the boxing in the flyweight class between Janes (112 lbs.) and L. English (1101/2 lbs.). Both lads rushed matters from the very outset, and slugged each other unnercifully. Janes, who was slightly superior, landed several telling blows which quickly weakened his man, and inside of one minute he had English down for a count of seven. After this Janes just waited an opportunity and getting the desired opening, floored his opponent with a body blow, tak-


