The Spectator's reporter visited the Exhibition grounds the other day, and was supprised to find the arrangements for men for the past few days have been employed in tearing down the military firtures in the building, and already nearly all the sheds. These pens are in the one range of sheds, being 16 feet wide. A carriage shed about 180x20 feet, has been louits long the same range as the plg pens, and an enclosed structure for fort of all kinds, 10 x 20 feet, the palace, has been erected. Six rings, 60 feet in diameter, for the purpose of exhibiting cattle will be prepared, and the old horse track is to be considerably improved by grading and the erection of a picket fence around it.
