

**Guelph Township Council.**

This Council met for general business and as a court of revision on Monday, the 7th, pursuant to adjournment. Jas. Lamb, Esq., presided in the chair. Present—Messrs. Lamb, Darby, Hayes and Sweetnam. The minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed. The Auditor, Messrs. Kennedy and Lowry, were present and submitted their annual financial statement, which was received and adopted. On motion made and seconded, the Council was resolved into a Court of Revision. The clerk stated there were no appeals to lay before the Court of Revision. The assessment roll shows an advance of \$70,000 over last year's assessment. On motion made the court then adjourned till next meeting of council, and the council resumed. The Reeve drew the attention of the council to a overcharge of taxes paid by Peter Gow, Esq., to the amount of \$13.20. Ordered to be refunded. The clerk presented a communication from Mr. John Murphy, declining to accept the office of pathmaster on the division to which he was appointed. It was ordered that he be appointed by Mr. Hayes, that Isaac P. Johnson be appointed Pathmaster in place of John Murphy, who declines to act. That Solomon Dawson be appointed on the Edinburgh road, and that Chas. Walker be appointed from the west corner of Lot A, Division E, to the Waterloo Road—Carried. The clerk stated he had received notices from Messrs. Thos. McCrae and John Reading, that they had declined being reappointed to the office of fence-viewers. Moved by Mr. Darby, seconded by Mr. Denham, that Messrs. Isaac Simpson and George Elliott be appointed fence-viewers in place of Thos. McCrae and John Reading, who decline to be reappointed.—Carried. The clerk was instructed to notify the parties of their appointments to their respective offices. An account was presented from Joseph Hook for \$1.50 for stones furnished by him for building culvert on town line.—Ordered to be paid. The clerk was instructed to present the amended School Act, for the use of members of Council. It was then moved and seconded to adjourn till Monday, the 19th day of May, then to meet for general business, in filling up pathmaster's schedules, for division of statute labor, etc., and as a court of revision.
