CAPAZZA'S PARACHUTE

Successful Experiment Near Paris with a Safety Invention. a Safety Invention.

A very interesting and successful experiment has been made in Paris by M. Capazza, the well-known aeronaut, with a "safety parachute" which he has invented. The apparatus is placed above the balloon, and to it are attached a number of very long ropes. If the balloon bursts the gas swells out the parachute, and so helps to diminish the rapidity of the descent.
