fact it is almost impossible to distinguish the country of the rural people from the city folks. That it is practically impossible to stand where the crowds pass and point out those from the city or country is generally admitted, and the question "why" was answered on Wednesday by some of the men best able to tell.

"The old farmer has passed away," said John Helder, of Lambton County. "The coming farmer never did, except in the minds of a few cartoonists. The Western Ontario farmer of the present is an agriculturist, meaning that he knows every fact in favor of scientific agriculture, and in favor of agriculture and the raising of crops as an exact science. The result is that the farmer keeps posted. My neighbors take the daily papers, subscribe for the best magazines, cultivate opportunities to increase their general knowledge, and above all, in a quiet way, they seize every fact that will help them to grow better crops, larger crops, or to secure finer quality."

"The difference is simple. The old-fashioned farmer tilled the ground in the way his father had, following tradition rather than a scientific method. Ontario farmers at present are agricultural school farmers. They want new methods and are keen for anything that will help them to get results, as a rule, of a business nature in introducing new economies, lowering cost and increasing profits."

J. W. Farnham, of Nissouri, said yesterday: "Do you know any reason why a farmer should look different from any other man? I don't. Farmers in my district have money, education and advantages. Some of them have hot water heating plants in their houses, and one has his house lit by acetylene gas. They keep big flocks of good crops, and good crops bring the money with which they furnish themselves, their families with the advantages that were formerly obtainable only in the cities. There isn't any carpet bag farmer now. A few more years and we shall be coming to one fair in automobiles."

An exhibit in the main building that has attracted much attention is a mastodon's jaw, found by Duncan Forbes at Mount Brydges. It is in a glass case upstairs, and is indeed a curiosity. It is a jaw of a mastodon that is occasionally found in America that a prehistoric race of animals once existed. Many and varied have been the comments raised upon this exhibit, but the limit was reached yesterday when a young farmer told his girl that he had been to the fair and had seen the jaw of the mastodon. He recognized the jaw of this one as belonging to one of the mastodons he had seen at the fair, and he had opened the mastodon's mouth to get out a cub bear which was in it when he shot the animal. "Wouldn't it be awful to have a mouth like that?" said the girl as they walked on—and no one knows what she was referring to.

IN THE CATTLE SHEDS

Short-horns Made by Far the Largest Exhibit This Year.

The cattle building at the Western Fair has been a point of great interest this week. There was a good showing of animals that was well worth seeing. Only a few breeds were nearly represented, the majority showing up well. There were no entries in Guernseys. One herd of Galloways was shown, that of Shaw & Marston, Brantford. The Polled Angus section was not filled either, though those exhibited were fine specimens of their breed.

The Short-horns predominated, there being more of them shown than the total of any four other breeds. There was a large number of entries in this class and some of the finest of Short-horns were shown. For instance, in the 2-year-old heifer class, Capt. T. E. Robson, of Ilkerton, showed the heifer which won first prize at Toronto fair. It won here also and Capt. Robson got second too. He won in the yearling heifer show, Goodfellow Bros., of Macville, second. The winners of the bull competition, bulls three years and over, were J. A. Crear, Shakespeare; John Fleming, London, and A. J. Watson, Castlederg. Capt. Robson's 2-year-old bull won first in his class, besides getting the sweepstakes ribbon for bulls. There were twelve yearlings, Goodfellow Bros., E. C. Aitell, Goderich, and Hugh Thompson, St. Marys, winning T. E. Robson's bull under three years won first and second, Goodfellow's third. In cows under three years, J. A. Crear won first and third, Goodfellow's second. The first and second in the 3-year-olds were won by Crear, and third by Goodfellow. In the heifer calves' entries James Kennedy got third; first, second and fourth all going to Capt. Robson. Crear got the sweepstakes for cows and heifers.

The show of Jerseys was very good. These favorites were of much interest to the fair visitors, and the exhibit was of much credit to those who brought them. The Holsteins were less conspicuous, there being but two exhibit-

A SHOOTING AT NAPANEE

A U. S. Pensioner Shot by Gun in Son's Hand.

Napanee, Ont., Sept. 18.—Stephen Smith, a United States pensioner, living in South Napanee, was shot by his son last night. It appears Stephen had received his pension and he and the son, Hiram, who is about 20 years of age, had been drinking some through the day and quarreled after returning to their home. Some of the neighbors entered the house, the son went outside and taking down a gun which was kept hanging on the wall over the back door of the kitchen, discharged it at his father from a distance of about fifteen feet. The contents lodged in the old man's upper thigh. It is thought the injury will not have a fatal effect. The son is under arrest.

CANADIANS IN TROUBLE

Two of Them Charged With Burglary at Ogdensburg.

Ogdensburg, N. Y., Sept. 18.—John Martin and Charles Wilson, two Canadians, who were arrested here, charged with burglary, have been identified by Inspector Murray, provincial detective, and by F. Beach, of Winchester, whose store they robbed. They will be extradited.

The Secretary of State has issued a warrant of surrender to the Dominion Government, turning over to them George H. Curtis, a deserter from the Ninth regiment, United States Army, wanted for robbing immigrants in Canada.

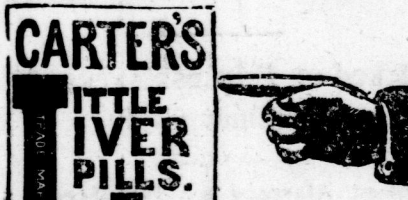

FACTORY TIED UP BY BUMBLEBEES

Thousands of Them Invade Canning Factory and Put Employees to Flight.

South Haven, Mich., Sept. 18.—(Special)—Thousands of big, buzzing bumblebees swooped down on the duckery canning factory here Tuesday afternoon, entering through open doors and windows, driving 100 girls employed from the rooming and sewing departments. The men in the paring and preserving departments threw aprons over their heads and made a dash for liberty. The men rallied and attempted to drive the bees out with smudges and burning torches, but were forced to give up the battle after suffering severe losses. Towards evening, the bees disappeared and the factory was opened during the night without any trouble, but again on Wednesday large swarms of bees invaded the factory once more.

Yesterday, the third day of the visitation, the bees were much fewer in number, and by keeping the doors and windows tightly closed, employees were able to work. Places about their heads, faces and arms showed signs of many stings. The strange visitation was accounted for by the large acreage of lowlands near the factory recently opened for celery growing. Odors of the large amount of fresh fruit and the smell of sprays radiating from the factory is thought to have attracted the bees.

THE NORTHWEST STORM

Londoners in Assinibola Did No Suffer Any Loss.

A reassuring message comes from the Northwest to Londoners, who have friends there. Mr. C. W. Smith, of this city, who has been in Assinibola, was anxious when he heard of the reported effects of the storm there, and wired to his eldest son, Albert Smith, who lives about ten miles from Weyburn, to find out how they had fared. The reply was received this morning and is to the effect that there has been no damage to the wheat crop in that district either from the storm or frost. The place referred to is 32 miles north of the North Dakota line, and is therefore indicative of the fact that the Assinibola farmers will not have suffered as much as it was at first thought.

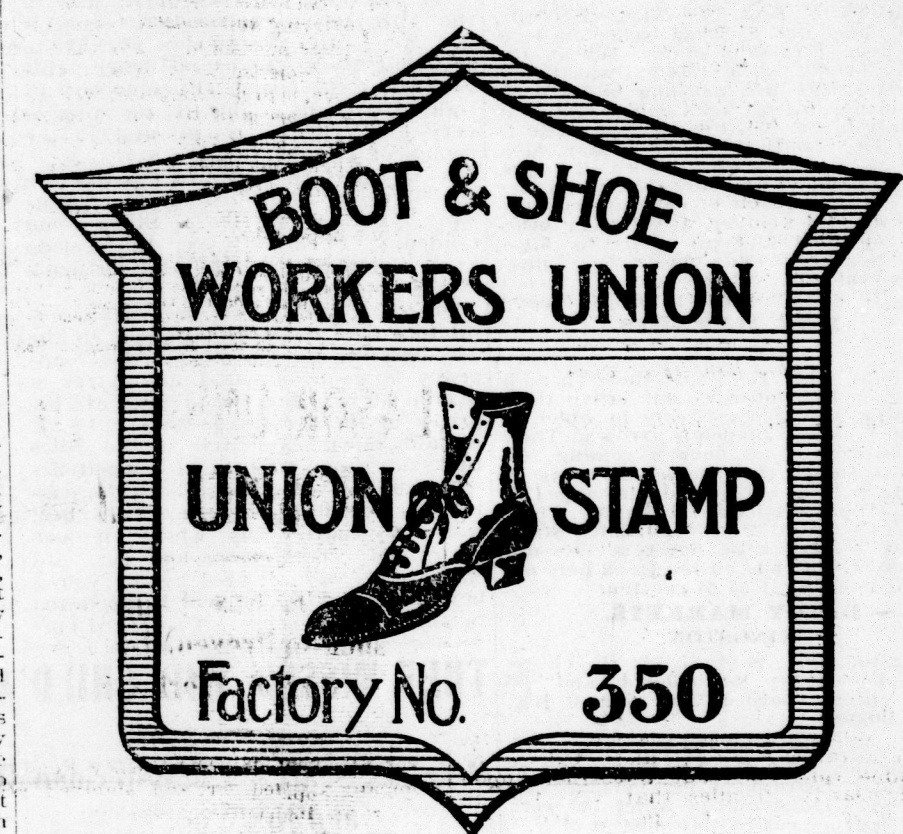
