

Apples are estimated somewhat lower for July than for June. Early and fall apples are estimated as slightly above medium. Winter apples at less than a medium crop. Quality

Pears are reported a light crop, ex cept in British Columbia and Southern Ontario, where a medium crop is expected.

Late peaches are reported light to medium. Cherries have proved a medium crop, and have sold at fair prices.

Early peaches are reported a full

Plums and Grapes. Plums are reported light generally. In British Columbia certain sections report a medium crop. In the Georgian Bay district three or four vari-

eties promise well. Grapes are reported a full crop. Strawberries and raspberries have been reduced by dry weather, but the

average has been very good. Small fruits, other than the above are yielding or promise a full crop. Tomatoes are a medium crip, ripen-


