MANIWAKA FIGHT

Jocose Remark Leads to a Serious

Stabbing Affray. Ottawa, Aug. 2 .- Charles Dumond lies in Maniwaki Hospital in a critical condition, with four gashes in the side and one on the head, committed by man named Cameron.

Cameron blew into Maniwaki on Friday evening last. On Saturday morning he seemed somewhat the worse for liquor but took a sleep and got up about noon. In the afternoon he strolled into the bar, where there were several men, one of whom made a jocose but inoffensive remark to Cameron.

This angered the latter, who invited him to mind his own business, at the same time handing him a swift and unexpected uppercut. he onlookers were too dazed to interfere before the stabbing was done.
