TO THE
ELECTORS
OF THE
North Riding Oxford:
GENTLEMEN.—As you will be called upon
shortly to elect a representative for this
county, for the Local Legislature of this Pro-
vince of Ontario, and having been presented
with a Requisition, numerously signed, from
the Township of Blenheim, in which I reside,
to come forward as a candidate for that posi-
tion, I have acceded to their request, and
submit your favor and support. I am per-
sonally known to a large number of the electors
of this Riding from my long residence in
North Oxford, and from having held for
several years the office of Reeve for the
Township of Blenheim.
The Bill for the Confederation of the Pro-
vince has now become law, and I look upon
it on the whole, as a measure that will place
us in a superior position to that which we
have hitherto occupied, which will do away for
ever, that bitterness of party strife, by giving
us that representation in the House of Com-
mons to which, we have been so long entitled,
and continuously refused, and by giving us
full control of our own local affairs. If elected
by you I shall always be found supporting
those measures of reform and improvement,
which, as a life-long reformer, I have always
advocated and supported. I believe it to be
of the utmost importance that an economical
course should be pursued in the working and
carrying out the New Constitution. In the
limits of a brief address I cannot enter at any
length into my views on all the subjects upon
which the Local Legislature will require to
deliberate. But I desire to state that I am
opposed to borrowing money on the credit of
the Province, but would much prefer that
Legislation should lead towards direct tax-
ation as I am convinced that by doing so
frugality and economy would be more rigidly
adhered to. In all municipal matters I shall
ever be found earnestly desiring to advocate
and support sound measures of Reform.
With regard to the educational interest of
the Province, I have always looked upon
our national school system as our pride and
glory, and shall be always found opposed to
any extension of the Sectarian principle in
our school system. With respect to the
management of our Public Lands which by
Confederation become the property of the
Local Legislature, I have always been in
favor of a liberal policy—I should view with
favor and give support to any measure having
for its object free grants to actual settlers,
and strenuously opposed to throwing large blocks
of land into the hands of speculators. By
such a policy I believe that the stream of
emigration could be largely directed to the
Confederate Provinces and instead of being a
burden to the revenues of the Province of On-
tario, would in a short time become a source
of interest thereto.
There are other subjects upon which the
Local Legislature will be called to legislate,
but on which I will not at this time dilate as
it is my intention in the course of the
next few weeks to visit the different portions
of the Riding.
