In acknowledging the receipt of the Address of this Gran Division to Her Majesty the Queen, the Right Hon, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, in a Letter addressed to His Excellency the Earl of Mulgrave, states that it was defined presented, and that "Her Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously."

In accordance with the resolutions passed at the Januar quarterly Session, the "Address to the Ecclesiastical Bodies was duly prepared and presented by the committee appoint for that purpose, and action had thereon, by such of the bodies as have met during the past month.

The Committee have also issued circulars to " all the Min isters of Religion in the Province," inviting them to meeti Convention, in the City of Halifax, on Wednesday, 4th de of August, "for the purpose of taking into consideration the present aspects and wants of the Temperance Cause in the Province."

You will have perceived by the Reports of the last Sessing of the Legislature, that the "Permissive Prohibitory Light Law Bill" was quietly shelved, and also that the New Liem Law was amended in some of its clauses since we met in our terly Session, and is therefore, now, less stringent than state in my last Report. However, we must not be discourage but have great encouragement to persevere, taking the Sta of Maine as an example. It may be needless for me to stat as you are already aware of the great fact, that the people Maine were nearly unanimous in their vote for a full Pro bitory Liquor Law, as spoken through the ballot box on t 7th June last. What they have accomplished, so may by steady perseverance and consistency.

I may here state that the New License Law is strictly a forced in some Counties, and our friends have been succes ful, in may instances, in preventing its being violated.

It becomes my painful duty, Officers and Brothers, announce to you the death of our excellent and esteen Brother, P. G. W. A., James Mosher, Eag., of No. 32, while event occurred at Windsor on the 6th June last. Brot Mosher was well known throughout Nova Scotia as a wa and consistent advocate of Total Abstinence, and was one the Fathers of the Cause in this Province, having comment his career as a Temperance man in the year 1828. Hisla as an active member of our Order, is much regretted by
