A number of people had withdrawn their subscriptions, yet there was encouragement to continue it another year, it was therefore decided, that the committee should meet to discuss and arrange for the coming year in St. John's School Room, January 3rd at 4 p.m. Miss Green gave a short reading on our own diocese. Miss Baker spoke of the Chinese work in British Columbia, and said it had been decided at the Board meeting, that Ontario Diocese would subscribe \$100 to help the work, the amount required from the Ottawa branch would be \$20.00.

The meeting closed with Doxology and Benediction.

The Ottawa Chapters of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew held their joint services on St. Andrew's Day at Christ Church. There was a celebration of the Holy Communion at 7.30 a.m. which was attended by about thirty members of the Brotherhood, besides several clergy and others. Evensong was said at 8 o'clock, when there was a full attendance of Brotherhood men from Ottawa, Hull, and Fallowfield. There was a full choir and a fair congregation. The Rev. J. G. Davidson, Rector of Peterborough, preaching on the text "Thou shalt not delay," pointed out many valuable lessons for the Brotherhood.

At the annual meeting of the Christ Church Chapter of the Brotherhood the following officers were elected for the coming year. Director, Dr. Wm. A. Leggo: Secretary-Treasurer, E. A. Richards. The Chapter numbered twelve members.

The men's Bible Class in connection with the Chapter and conducted by the Rev. W. M. Loucks, was resumed in Advent, and meets each Wednesday evening at 8 o'clock. The Bible Class is preceded by Evensong at 7.30.
