ELECTION OF MODERATOR.

The retiring Moderator then proceeded to nominate his successor—the Rev. Dr. Somerville, Glasgow. He said:—"Fathers and brethren, it now only remains for me to exercise the privilege—and I esteem it to be one—of proposing my successor in this chair."

Mr. Gray, of Gray and Kinfauns, (elder,) said:—"Moderator, I desire, with due deference to your statement, to second the nomination you have made; and it is only needful for me to add a very few words, after the emphatic testimony you have borne to the character and work of the gentleman you have named, to occupy the Moderator's chair."

The election was unanimous, and intimation of the honour conferred upon him was conveyed to Dr. Somerville by a deputation of ex-Moderators, who accompanied him into the hall.

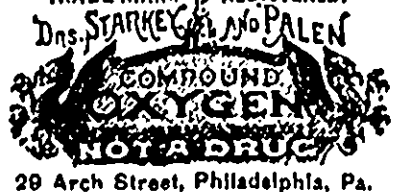
