
The contents of this package consist of one ounce dissolved with an equal weight of distilled water.

Extensive tests proved very satisfactory as a germicide, but it is expected that its chief value will be in the treatment of enteric diseases. It is best as to dose, etc., see enclosed literature.

Acetozone is very readily decomposed, and special attention must be exercised to prevent decomposition in hot places in vicinity of a steam pipe, where it is a heated object. If heated to boiling point, an explosion may result. Avoid contact with heavy metals when decomposed. In making solutions of Acetozone, alcohol, glyceric acid and other agents should not be employed.
