SPREAD OF INFECTION BY PAWNBROK-ERS AND SUCH .-- It may be useful (Galliard Med. Four.) to draw the attention ! to a source of propagation of infection; among the poor, which sanitary authorities appear seldom to consider, or often to overlook. We refer to the spread of contagion through the medium of clothes deposited in pawnbrokers' shops. The persistency with which the contagium of certain zymotic diseases, and especially of measles, scarlatina, and smallpcy, clings to clothes is well recognized by the medical profession. Not a few cases have been recorded of the propagation of these diseases by means of the retention of infecting power in clothes, which had been shut up in boxes for months after exposure to the original infection. There is danger in purchasing at "second hand" shops.

MALARIA IN FLOWER-POTS.—Tending to corroborate the idea that malaria is caused by any vegetable decomposition is the case reported by Dr. Eichwald, of St. Petersburg, of a lady who lived constantly in a room filled with flowers in pots, and who thus acquired an intermittent fever, with symptoms of true malaria. Too much of any thing is bad.
