

appropriate reserve lands for federal public purposes, subject to improvements; schools; control of liquor traffic; hunting and fishing in ceded area subject to Dominion regulations.

Treaty presents

\$12.00 a head; various items for agricultural equipment, supplies, etc.; flags and medals.

Annuities

By census, \$5.00 to each registered Indian; chiefs \$25.00, headmen \$15.00; \$1,500.00 annually for ammunition; triennial suit of clothes to each chief and headman.

Treaty No. 4

September 15, 1874 -- Cree, Saulteaux and others. Mainly southern Saskatchewan.

Area ceded, 74,600 square miles.

Government obligations

Reserves one square mile for family of five -- subject to Government's rights to deal with settler on reserve lands; right to sell or lease reserve lands with consent of Indians and to appropriate reserve lands for federal public purposes subject to compensation for improvements and lands; schools; right to hunt, trap and fish in tract surrendered subject to Government regulations; control of liquor traffic.

Treaty presents

Indians \$12.00, chiefs \$25.00, headmen \$15.00; miscellaneous agricultural equipment, supplies, etc.; flags and medals.
