## <u>Technical Co-operation of the</u> League of Nations

In view of the views expressed by the Japanese Government against foreign intervention in China and to its assumption of the role of protector, the work which the League of Nations has been carrying on in the fields of medical, engineering and economic advice to the Chinese Government in its work of rehabilitation, may encounter the active opposition of Japan. An account of the work of Dr. Rajchman, the League appointee, in China from October 1933 to April, 1934, will be found on pages 73 to 79 of the Report on the Work of the League since the Fourteenth Session of the Assembly, Part I, and the question may be raised as to whether this work should be continued. It is not, however, a question on which the Canadian Delegation can profitably reach a conclusion until the need of China and the position of Japan in the matter becomes more evident and there has been an opportunity for consultation with other Delegations at Geneva.
