AFRICAN ECONOMISTS VISIT OTTAWA

THE DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS ANNOUNCED TO-DAY THAT A GROUP OF FOURTEEN GOVERNMENT ECONOMISTS FROM AFRICA ARE SPENDING FOUR DAYS IN OTTAWA THIS WEEK FOR STUDY AND DISCUSSION WITH CANADIAN OFFICIALS OF THE VARIOUS GOVERNMENT DEPARTMENTS, THE BANK OF CANADA AND THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION.

THE OTTAWA VISIT WAS ARRANGED JOINTLY BY THE CANADIAN GOVERNMENT AND THE UNITED NATIONS HEADQUARTERS IN NEW YORK, AS PART OF
A SIX-MONTH PROGRAMME UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE UNITED NATIONS
TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE ADMINISTRATION. THE GROUP HAS ALREADY SPENT
SOME TIME IN THE UNITED STATES, ATTENDING LECTURES AND GROUP
DISCUSSIONS ON ALL PHASES OF PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION AND ECONOMIC
DEVELOPMENT. THE ECONOMISTS SPENT TWO DAYS IN MONTREAL LAST WEEK
VISITING THE OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF MAYORS AND MUNICIPALITIES,
THE FOUNDATION ENGINEERING COMPANY OF CANADA, AND THE ALUMINUM
COMPANY OF CANADA. SOME OF THE GROUP WILL LEAVE OTTAWA ON
JANUARY 28 TO RETURN TO MONTREAL. THE OTHERS WILL GO TO LEVIS,
CUIEBEC, TO OBSERVE CREDIT UNIONS AND COOPERATIVES IN THE AREA.

THIS IS THE THIRD INTENSIVE TRAINING PROGRAMME ARRANGED BY UNITED NATIONS HEADQUARTERS FOR AFRICAN OFFICIALS. SIMILAR COURSES WERE HELD IN 1957-58 AND 1958-59.
