THE SECRETARY OF STATE FOR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS PRESENTS THE
SECOND VOLUME OF THE CANADIAN ANTI-APARTHEID REGISTER
TO THE SECRETARY-GENERAL OF THE UNITED NATIONS

The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Right Honourable Joe Clark, today presented the second volume of the Canadian Anti-Apartheid Register to the Secretary General of the United Nations, His Excellency Javier Pérez de Cuéllar, at the General Assembly Hall of the United Nations.

The Register, which was first announced by Mr. Clark on September 13, 1985, covers the period April 1986 to August 1987. It contains the names of some 5,000 Canadian individuals, firms, organizations and municipal governments who have written to Mr. Clark indicating actions they have taken to demonstrate their opposition to apartheid.

In presenting the Register, Mr. Clark reaffirmed Canada's continuing opposition to apartheid. The Register reflects widespread effort and commitment on the part of Canadians to contribute to fundamental change in South Africa.
