Mr. MACDONNELL (Muskoka-Ontario): Then, if we take these it is understood we shall have the new schedule put on *Hansard*; the minister can give us these figures of expected savings on the various items and that will apply to schedule I and schedule II.

Mr. ABBOTT: I have not given the particulars yet on schedules I and II, except in the most general form. As I have said, fiften items are being deleted from schedule I. There are seven added to schedule II, and there are these very minor changes to schedule III. I could ask the officials to make some estimate as to what may be the effect on balance in savings or otherwise of United States dollars as a result of these proposed changes. I do not think it will be substantial; I think the changes are more in the nature of relaxing in order to facilitate the importation of certain goods from soft currency areas. I do not think the effect on balance would appreciably change the estimate of approximately \$300,000,000 which I gave in the press statement following the announcement. The changes are intended to facilitate the easier flow of trade and more particularly to assist or at least not to impede the importation from sterling areas of goods which can be properly brought in.

Mr. MACDONNELL (Muskoka-Ontario): At any rate, if the minister gives us the details for each item, both those appearing in the bill and the new ones, we shall be able to make an estimate for ourselves.

Mr. ABBOTT: It might be of assistance to the committee if I were to place on Hansard, for study tomorrow, a summary of the changes in schedule I, II and III. If that is on Hansard hon. members can take the bill as it is printed; each of these changes will be identified by a tariff item number, and they can turn up each one in schedule I, II or III, as the case may be, to see exactly what the change is.

Mr. MACDONNELL (Muskoka-Ontario): That is quite satisfactory to me.

The CHAIRMAN: Then is it agreeable to the committee that the minister shall have leave to place this statement on *Hansard*?

Some hon. MEMBERS: Agreed.

Mr. ABBOTT: Then I formally place on *Hansard* a statement outlining the changes to which I have just referred. The statement is as follows:

26 Coffee, roasted or ground, and all imitations thereof and substitutes therefor, including acorn nuts, n.o.p.

29 Coffee, green, n.o.p. (not imported direct from the country of growth and production.)

ex 228 Toilet soap.

252 Shoe blacking; shoemakers' ink; shoe, harness and leather dressing, and knife or other polish or composition, n.o.p.

652 Toilet or dressing combs, n.o.p.; fancy combs, not being jewelry.

665 Torpedoes, firecrackers and fireworks of all kinds.

ex 695 Paintings in oil or water colours and ex 695a pastels (not to include paintings in oil or water colours and pastels to be used exclusively for printing or lithographic reproduction purposes).

The following items to be added after item 1976:

ex 192 Papers and paperboards or fibreex 197 boards the surface of which is in two ex 198 or more colours or is embossed or

ex 199 otherwise decorated.

ex 199b Empty containers wholly or partially manufactured from paperboard or fibreboard having affixed thereto paper the surface of which is in two or more colours, or is embossed or otherwise decorated.
