The following answer, deposited with the Clerk of the house, is printed in the official report of debates pursuant to standing order 39:

THE CENSUS—EMPLOYMENT OF WORKERS

Question No. 210—Mr. Regier:

1. In regard to the forthcoming census, are officers being advised to consult the national employment service offices for potential helpers?

2. If not, for what reason?

Answer by: Hon. George H. Hees (Minister of Trade and Commerce):

1 and 2. The census commissioners were appointed by the Minister of Trade and Commerce and, as has been stated on several occasions, he obtained recommendations from a number of sources. Census temporary clerical staff will be appointed by the civil service commission which consults local offices of national employment service. Census enumerators will be appointed by each census commissioner. They have been instructed to obtain competent people and they will, as occasion requires, consult with the national employment service.
