earlier this month. Within the three minutes allowed me, I think that answers the question in the narrow context in which it was placed on *Hansard* yesterday. The hon. member, as usual, expanded it tonight because he is allowed seven minutes compared with my three.

The hon. member mentioned one or two other positive things that have been done, such as doubling cash advances, which must have been of help to the farmers in that area. They would have been able to get cash to take care of costs incurred last fall and through the winter.

I do not try to contend that this is a complete answer to the problem, which is a very

serious one. However, I do not accept his contention that the Canadian government or the agencies of the farmers, such as the Canadian Wheat Board and other bodies involved, are doing anything less than the full amount that they think is advisable in a sales promotion campaign. There is a very vigorous sales promotion campaign in regard to all cereals and other crops which can be grown on this land. I see my time has expired.

Mr. Deputy Speaker: Order. I am afraid the minister's time has expired.
