The Society have not yet been able to finish within-side the College at Barbadoes, directed to be built by General Codrington. The Case without is compleated, but by Reason of a Debt due to the Society from that Estate, they are obliged to deser sinishing within; but hope that in about two Years that Incumbrance will be discharged, and then the Society design speedily to compleat the whole.

The Auditors of the Society likewise in the examination of their Accounts, have observed to the Society, that their Disbursements by Payment of yearly Salaries to Missionaries, Catechists, Schoolmasters, &c. supplying them with large quantities of Books, proper and useful in their Missions, and other accidental Charges; do always exceed their certain yearly Income, which arises by the Subscriptions of their Members, Rent of Lands and by Money laid out in Securities, in a very considerable Sum; but that this Desiciency hath, through the good Providence of God, been hitherto supplied by Benefactions and Legacies, occasionally given to the Society, by well dispect Persons.
