THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL SD-245.

An Act for the relief of Philip Dalglish.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Philip Dalglish, domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Lachine, in the province of Quebec, has by his petition alleged that on the seventeenth day of August, A.D. 1957, at the city of Louisville, in the state of Kentucky, one of the United States of America, he and Rosemarie Bohn were married; and whereas by his petition he has prayed that, on the ground of her adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of his petition be granted: 10
Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage
dissolved.

1. The said marriage is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes 15
