welfare. And for such purpose, the external commerce and navigation of the
Province ought to be subject to the control of British Laws: but we are not
aware that the same principle of common
benefit requires these powers to be extended to the internal commerce of the
Province. There may be reasons to savour such a measure; to us they have
not occurred: but if there be no reason
that can justify such measure, we submit
that the species of commerce so to be affected ought to be distinctly stated to be
the external commerce of the Province.

The Bill, adopting the spirit of the Act passed in the 18th year of his present Majesty, enacted, that "the produce of all du"ties, imposed by the British Parliament,
"shall at all times hereafter be applied
to and for the use of each of the said
"Provinces respectively, and in such man-

" ner
