

§ 132. MODEL OF GRAMMATICAL PARSING.

I. Noun :—I. *Kind* (Common, Proper) ; 2. *Number* ; 3. *Gender* ; 4. *Case* ; 5. *Syntax*.

II. Pronoun :—I. *Kind* (Personal, Demonstrative, &c.) ; 2. *Person* ; 3. *Number* ; 4. *Gender* ; 5. *Case* ; 6. *Syntax*.

III. Adjective :—I. *Kind* ; 2. *Degree of Comparison* ; 3. *Function* (attribute of).

IV. Verb :—I. *Kind* (Transitive, Intransitive) ; 2. *Conjugation* (Strong, Weak) ; 3. *Voice* ; 4. *Mood* ; 5. *Tense* ; 6. *Person* ; 7. *Number* ; 8. *Syntax* (agreeing with) ; 9. *Parts* ; (Present, Past, Passive Participle).

V. Adverb :—I. *Kind* ; 2. *Degree of Comparison* ; 3. *Function* (qualifying Verb, Adjective, or Adverb).

VI. Preposition :—I. *Kind* ; 2. *Function* (joining a Noun to a Noun, &c.).

VII. Conjunction :—I. *Kind* ; 2. *Function* (joining two sentences co-ordinately or subordinately).

EXAMPLE.

My father lived at Blenheim then,
 Yon little stream hard by ;
 They burnt his dwelling to the ground,
 And he was forced to fly.

My ... Pronoun, personal, possessive, 1st person, singular number, common gender, attribute of *father*.

father ... Noun, common, singular number, masculine gender, nominative case, subject of *lived*.
