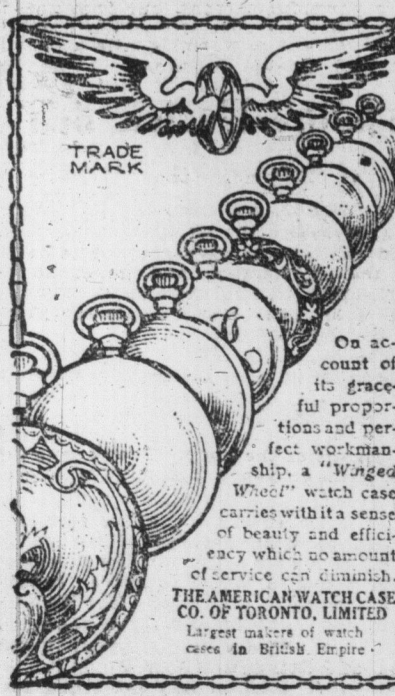

"Squealers" Fear For Their Lives

Rose, Webber and Vallon Expect Attack if Taken to Court Thru Streets. NEW YORK, Aug. 6.—(Can. Press.)—Death threats have been repeatedly sent to "Bald Jack" Rose, "Bridgie" Webber and Harry Vallon, who have made confessions showing alleged relations between the police and gamblers, and all three prisoners are in a state of panic over fears that their lives may be taken. The three gamblers say that they expect to be killed if they are taken thru the streets to court. It is reported that the prisoners have been intimidated by emissaries who have been smuggled into the west side jail.

DR. ROCHE AND THE MEDICOS

OTTAWA, Aug. 6.—(Hon. Dr. Roche, secretary of state, who has been absent from the capital for the past two months, will return Tuesday. WORRIED, POLICEMAN ENDS LIFE NEW YORK, Aug. 6.—(Can. Press.)—James Tobin, a mounted patrolman, who was attached to the College Point police precinct, shot and killed himself today. Worry over the present police scandal, also personally not in the least affected by its revelations, is supposed to have caused him to take his life. Tobin said before he killed himself: "A man might as well be dead as to be a policeman. Everybody thinks a cop's a crook. Even if you get off the force people are suspicious of you, just because you were once on the police force."
