Consequently we declare that kings are not subject to any ecclesiastical power by the order of God; that they cannot be deposed directly or indirectly by the authority of the keys of the thurch; that their subjects cannot be exempted from the submission and the obedience which they owe, or released from their oath of fidelity; that this decrine, necessary to the public peace, and equally advantageous to the thurch as to the State, ought to be held as conformable to holy scripture, the tradition of the fathers of the Church and examples of the Saints.


