PREFERENTIAL TRADE.
The representatives of the Canadian Boards of Trade did not succeed in converting the Congress of Chambers of Commerce to their scheme for the establishment of closer trade relations between the Mother Country and the colonies, by means of preferential tariffs. This was hardly to be expected. But the Canadian representatives have made considerable headway in forcing their views upon the attention of the people of Great Britain. We imagine the issue is now squarely before the statesmen and people of the Mother Country. The Congress was a resolution, urging upon Her Majesty's Government, the appointment of a Royal Commission, "to consider the possibilities of increasing and strengthening the trade relations between the different portions of the Empire." This is a distinct step forward. It shows that the people of Great Britain are prepared to discuss the pros and cons of the Canadian proposition. There is already noticeable a weakening of the Manchester forces and the Manchester free trade ideas. The remarks of Mr. Ritchie, president of the Board of Trade, and Mr. J. B. Young, secretary, are evidence of this. He said he believed the days of the strict Manchester free trade school were passing, and he thought that there might be arranged a closer reciprocal connection between the Motherland and the colonies. All the details of the debate in the Congress are not to hand, we take it from the despatches already received, that the Canadians have scored at the meeting. While we feel certain that reciprocal preferential trade relations will eventually be established through the Empire, we recognize the fact that there is a lot of work to be done before we have the movement in hand. In the first place a change of government will be necessary in Canada. The agitation will be ineffective until it has the force of the Canadian and other colonial governments behind it. The attitude assumed by the British Government on this subject is a matter of great importance. It is useless to urge reciprocal trade upon Great Britain, because that country will never abandon its free trade principles. This is also the Globe's position and yesterday it gave prominence to an opinion of Mr. J. B. Young, secretary of the Empire, on this important question. It is incredible as it may seem, the manufacturers and business men of Canada will find the first work cut out for them in this country. They will either have to convert their minds or replace the Premier by Sir Charles Tupper, who is right in line with their policy. It will be almost impossible to make further headway in Great Britain as long as a Canadian Government throws cold water on the scheme. The establishment of reciprocal preferential trade relations between the Empire is a policy upon which Canada should be agreed to a man. Sir Wilfrid Laurier says he would not object to seeing the Mother Country give the colonies a preference in her markets. He has already conducted a similar policy of preferential trade. Why then should he not use Great Britain's policy which he has put in force in Canada? The issue between the Liberal and Conservative parties on this question is clearly drawn. Sir Wilfrid Laurier takes plain navy or black, silkette band and special wash band. 85c.
