Ottawa, April 28.—The contract was signed yesterday between the government and the Ross Rifle Company for the manufacture in Canada of Ross rifles for the government. As the Minister announced in his statement, the factory is to be situated in Quebec. Between 200 and 300 hands are to be employed at the outset, although it is estimated that in a very short time the number of employees will be fully 1000.
