

Labor Unions of Canada Enter Protest SCHEDULE FOR NEW MEASURE FILED. Against the Present Laws and Methods

Animated Interview of Government Ministers With Large Delegation Representing the Industrial Dominion—Mr. Blair Loses Temper and Grows Painfully Personal.

Ottawa, April 6.—(From World staff correspondent.)—Sir William Mulock, Hon. A. G. Blair and ex-Premier Emerson, in his private capacity, received twenty-five delegates from the various labor unions affiliated with the Trades Congress of Canada this morning. They represented labor unionism from the Atlantic to the Pacific. John A. Flett introduced the delegation. A. W. Patten, M.P. (Winnipeg) and Ralph Smith, M.P. (Vancouver) were the only members of parliament who accompanied the delegation. They did so on invitation. Other M.P.s were not invited, for instance, E. F. Clarke, M.P.

Purpose of the Government.
John Flett, in presenting the request of the delegation, told Sir William that the government had promised to give an eight-hour day to the I.C.R. employees last year, but up to the present had failed to do so. J. D. G. O'Donoghue, legal adviser to the government, presented draft bills of the proposed anti-contract law. He declared the present act had not helped the laboring men. Charges against the government were made. The government was accused of being a labor union in the expense of pushing a case to a final and put in the government. He got into an altercation with Sir William when he declared that a government interpreter named Murray had gone to the United States and brought into Sydney a number of Italians and negroes, who were employed in preference to Canadians.

O'Donoghue pushed his authority. A Mr. Sharkey, an employee of the I.C.R., broke in by declaring that Murray was only an occasional employee.

James Strong Charges.
O'Donoghue, referring to the trouble at the Kingston Locomotive Works, declared that men were brought from Scotland and Germany under false pretences, and dumped on the Canadian labor market. He declared that the bill would not interfere with any new industry for which labor could not be got in Canada. The immigration act would not be interfered with.

A. W. Patten, M.P., suggested amendments to the Conciliation Act of 1906, aiming to carry the principle of conciliation as far as possible without verging on compulsion. The Minister of Labor is given large powers. The laborer is made free to choose his own union. The government is given the right to call in any union.

Much Time for a Hearing.
The request of the truckers and checkers of the I.C.R. developed the fact that it had taken the men eighteen months to get a hearing from the general manager of the I.C.R. Mr. Blair tried to vindicate his position and shift the blame to the I.C.R. but P. M. Draper, who presented the facts, declared:

"You, as Minister of Railways, have not given us even the consideration you have given men who belong to international unions. These men have only a Canadian voice."

Mr. Blair: How long since they got a raise?
Mr. Sharkey, an employee of the I.C.R., broke in with a raise of 3 1/2 cents a day last year.

Mr. Blair Gets Personal.
Mr. Blair blurted out at Sharkey: "You have not been a good employee. You have been agitator ever since you came into the service. You have made it impossible to get along in harmony with the workers."

P. M. Draper deprecated the heat with which Mr. Blair had made a personal attack on a member of the delegation, and added: "The officials of the I.C.R. have got the men so afraid of losing their positions that they do not dare to express their grievances. I do not believe Sir William knows this, and that is why I bring it up. If a body of workers belong to a union, it is organization, as distinguished from an international body, the general manager of the I.C.R. will tell them. We want to operate the Canadian labor movement, and believe that strikes should not occur."

The grand officers of international unions come over here, take the officials of the I.C.R. by the throat and get whatever they want."

Declared Wanting Justice.
Mr. Blair: "I don't think that is a fair statement."
Mr. Draper: "Well, it is a statement of facts. Mr. Pottinger refused to see the truckers and the checkers for eighteen months."

Mr. Draper then went on to say that this state of affairs had created great discontent in the districts through which the I.C.R. ran, when Mr. Blair blurted out:

"I don't believe a word of it. This whole appeal served to show how petulant Mr. Blair is over any lack of praise for his system. The delegates were much annoyed by his personal attack on one of their number."

John Flett spoke strongly for the need of having the fair wage scale inserted in all government contracts, insuring the Kingston Locomotive Works as a horrible example of its absence. There handy men filled the place of skilled workmen. This had imported men from Germany and Scotland and were securing all Europe to get more.

Makes Other Denials.
Mr. Blair took exception to Mr. Flett's remark, but the government had entered into a contract with Hon. William Harty at a high price, and said that the locomotives at Lake Huron had been bought at a high price, but the figures that they could be secured for in the United States.

This led Mr. Flett to say that he would prefer to have the government buy engines in the United States than to have them made in Canada by cheap inferior labor. He did not wish the conditions of the labor market to be degraded, even on a national basis. To Sir William Mulock nodded his head.

Mr. Hennessey of the Toronto Letter Carrier made a strong plea for his fellow workers. He wanted a 20 per cent raise in wages. The majority of letter carriers in Canada were out for 11.

Anti-Gambling Law Weak Severe Penalty for "Protection," Too Here is the Criminal Code

The agitation over suppression of gambling joints has reached some considerable proportions in Toronto. Most of the public officials who are charged with the regulation of this vice candidly admit that joints of this character are numerous in the city. Most of them insist that the law is defective. Chief Grasett says his men are met with barred doors, chains and electric bells when they seek to break into such places.

The World herewith presents the sections of the Criminal Code under which gambling is declared a crime, together with the clauses which declare it an indictable offence to bar the way of officers with "chains and other devices," such as the Grasett complaint of. Incidentally, The World presents this section of the Criminal Code which declares it an indictable offence for an officer or prosecuting authorities charged with the suppression of gambling or other vice to fail to discharge the obligations imposed.

It is in other words, the Crown Attorney who fails to do his duty in this respect, who acquiesces in the law on the subject. It reads strong, but the authorities maintain that it is deficient. Incidentally, it may be mentioned that it is the formal law against such crimes found sufficient, with proper efforts of officers, everywhere:

HERE IS CANADA'S CRIMINAL CODE.

Criminal Code, Chap. 29, Sec. 196: A common gaming house is: (a) A house, room or place kept by any person for gain, to which persons resort for the purpose of playing at any game of chance; or (b) A house, room or place kept or used for playing therein at any game of chance for gain, in which (1) A bank is kept by one or more of the players exclusively of the others; or (2) In which any game is played, the chances of which are not alike favorable to all the players, including among the players the banker or other person by whom the game is managed, or against whom the other players stake, play or bet.

Sec. 197: A common betting-house is a house, office, room, or other place, where or in which, for the purpose of betting between persons resorting thereto, and— (1) The owner, occupier or keeper thereof; (2) Any person using the same; (3) Any person procured or employed by, or acting for or on behalf of any such person; (4) Any person having the care or management or in any manner conducting the business thereof.

Sec. 198: Every person is guilty of an indictable offence and liable to one year's imprisonment who keeps any disorderly house, that is to say, any common gaming house or common betting house as hereinafter defined. (a) Any one who appears, acts or behaves as master or as the person having the care, government or management of any disorderly house, shall be deemed to be the keeper thereof, and shall be liable to be prosecuted and punished as such, in fact or in law, or in the name of the owner or keeper thereof.

Sec. 199: Everyone who plays or looks on while any other person is playing in a common gaming house is guilty of an offence and liable, on summary conviction before two justices of the peace to a penalty not exceeding \$100 and not less than \$20, and in default of payment to two months' imprisonment.

TIP TO THE CHIEF ON BOLTS AND BARS.
Sec. 200: Every one is guilty of an indictable offence and liable on summary conviction before two justices of the peace, to a penalty not exceeding \$100, and to six months' imprisonment with or without hard labor, who— (a) Willfully prevents any constable or other officer duly authorized to enter any disorderly house, as mentioned in Sec. 198, from entering the same or any part thereof; or (b) Obstructs or delays any such constable or officer in so entering; or (c) By any bolt, chain or other contrivance secures any external or internal door, or means of access to, any common gaming house so authorized to be entered; or (d) Uses any means or contrivance whatever for the purpose of preventing, obstructing or delaying the entry of any constable or officer, authorized as aforesaid, into any such disorderly house or any part thereof.

Sec. 204: Every one is guilty of an indictable offence and liable to one year's imprisonment, and to a fine not exceeding \$1000, who uses or knowingly keeps or part of any premises under his control to be used for the purpose of recording or registering any bet or wager, or selling any pool, or Records or registers any bet or wager, or sells any pool upon the result of any race.

DECLARES PROFESSIONAL GAMBLERS VAGRANTS.

Vagrancy—Sec. 207: Every person is a loose, idle or disorderly person or vagrant who— (a) Not having any visible means of maintaining himself, lives without any employment; (b) Having no peaceable profession or calling to maintain himself, sells by for the most part supports himself by gambling.

HARD ON MEN WHO "PROTECT" GAMBLERS.
Corruption and disobedience—Sec. 125: Every one is guilty of an indictable offence and liable to fourteen years' imprisonment, who— (a) Being a justice of the peace, peace officer, or public officer, employed in any capacity for the prosecution or detection or punishment of offenders, corruptly accepts or obtains, or agrees to accept or attempts to obtain for himself or for any other person, any money or valuable consideration, either in whole or in part, with intent to interfere corruptly with the due administration of justice, or (b) Being a justice of the peace, peace officer, or public officer, corruptly accepts or obtains, or agrees to accept or attempts to obtain for himself or for any other person, any money or valuable consideration, either in whole or in part, with intent to prevent or obstruct the due administration of justice, or (c) Being a justice of the peace, peace officer, or public officer, corruptly accepts or obtains, or agrees to accept or attempts to obtain
