Several Parties of Canadian and American Surveyors Will Begin Work Next Month.

work of delimiting the Canada-Alaska boundary according to the finding of the London tribunal, will be begun early in June, and will be prosecuted by several parties of Canadian and American surveyors, operating conjointly, until the end of September. From Mount Estelias northward to the shores of the frozen sea the line has already been laid along the 141st parallel, according to treaty. This portion of the boundary was not in dispute. From St. Elias east and south around the coast strip to the head of Portland Canal a distance of 550 miles, the Londoary will have to be marked by the surveyors, as determined by the tribunal.

It is expected that about one-tenth of this distance will be delimited by the joint survey this season. This does not mean that it will take ten years to complete the marking of the boundary line; all that will require to be jaid.
