SHOWING UP GOOD FOLLOWING RAINS

Two Athletic Moundsmen Are Insect Pests Doing Damage in Some Sections.

Toronto, June 9.—The following is a summary of report made by agricuitural representatives to the Ontario Department of Agriculture:

Rains on Saturday brought a meas-

worth from \$60 to \$80 per acre—and even more if purchased late.
Ontario County reports that a considerable acreage of flax will be grown for fibre this season.
Fruit trees as a rule are laden with setting fruit. Strawberries also promise a big crop, but require more rain.
Oxford asserts that the supply of all kinds of fodder was never so low as at present. Hay is selling in the province at from \$24 to \$40 a ton.
Live stock on the grass are not making flesh as satisfactorily as usual owing to the poor condition of pastures. Peterboro reports sales of cattle at from 10 to 13 cents a pound, and of calves at from 15 to 17 cents a pound. Elgin quotes export steers as going at from 13 to 14 cents a pound.
Some dairymen in Brant are disposing of a number of their cows rather than sell their milk at present factory prices, the June rate being set at \$2.55 a cwt. for a 3.5 test. Lambton reports that a Detroit firm has cream buyers and gatherers on the road in that country who are giving prices ranging Skip C. Brothers Are Arrested, Found Guilty and Fined \$200 Each.

WINDSOR, June 8.—Bert Ham, Montreal, and his brother, Louis Ram, of Detroit, were each fined \$200 and costs in police court at Sandwich today on a charge of violating the Ontario temperance act by soliciting orders for the Dominion Liquor Company of Montreal. They claimed their father was manager of the Montreal concern, and that they were merely taking orders along the border for the firm. They met Inspector Connor of the Ontario License Board, who arrested them when they tried to obtain an order from him.

EXTEND TIME FOR PATENT MEDICINE SALE

OTTAWA, June 8.—In order to permit distributors and retailers of patent and proprietary medicines to dispose of stock which was in hand on the 7th of July, but which, through the amendment by section 5 of chapter 66 of the statutes of 1919, which was not possible, an order-in-council has been passed authorizing the sale or disposition of such medicines, provided the same comply with the provisions of the proprietary or patent medicines act. 1908, up to the 1st of September, 1920. It is expected that this extension will permit of the sale of the articles referred to by distributors and retailers. On and after September 1 next the department of health will enforce the provision of the amended act of 1919.
