One more day's returns will bring the total of men in Toronto military district who have registered under the Military Service Act up to the forty thousand mark. By last night the total had reached 38,699. This was made up of 35,392 who claimed exemp-tion and 3307 who reported as ready for military service. There are only five more days for men to answer the call. The registration in Toronto itself was brisker yesterday than on any preceding day. For a great part of the time the applicants were lined up two deep at the Adelaide street post-office.
