

Ottawa, Nov. II—As usual, little business was done at the opening of parlia-After the ceremonies in the senate Sir Wilfrid Laurier was given a great reception in the senate on his entrance.

After the formalities the new members were introduced. Hon. W. L. MacKenzie King was presented by Sir Wilfrid Laurier and Hon. George P. Graham; D. Lafortune, of Lotbiniere, was introduced by Sir Wilfrid and Hon. Mr. Brodeur; J. M. Douglas, of Strathcona, was introduced by Sir Wilfrid and Hon. Frank Oliver. There were no Conservatives.
