## A LESSON FOR VON BERNSTORFF

Atlantic Open To Him Only  
By Courtesy of Fee

**A Study of Britons**

**Stewart Lyon of Canadian Press Reports Some Phases of Soldier Life Which He Found Among Overseas Troops at Halifax**

(By Stewart Lyon, Special Correspondent of Canadian Press)

Halifax, N. S., Mar. 3.—Count John von Bernstorff has had occasion recently to contrast British and German methods of empire building. When the count and his retinue passed up the harbor of Halifax in the Frederick VIII to the land-locked inn to the residence known as Bedford House, there to be subjected to a careful search for dangerous documents or contraband articles, they sailed within pistol shot of a huge transport laden with Canadians on their way to the front.

Von Bernstorff, and his staff, in the darkness of the night, saw nothing of the troops or of the vessels of war that lay near by. But the count knew that it was only by the courtesy of his country's foes the Atlantic was open to him while Canada's fighting men went out without let or hindrance, guarded as they have been since the first by the warships that have safely piloted every transport on the Atlantic route.

Why had Bernstorff to submit to the indignity of detention by the representative of British sea power while despite the best efforts of the Germans undersea, Britain's soldiers can pass in safety? The obvious answer is that the German navy is not a match for that of the United Kingdom, and therefore must yield control on the surface, however desperately it may strive for mastery beneath.

The British navy was ready. By its preparedness the war was won before a shot was fired. Without the British navy to keep the seas, Germany would have had victory speedy and complete.

Why was the British navy ready amid a thousand unreadinesses and aches? Because it mirrored the national genius and typified the British love of adventure. For centuries the island has voyaged to far lands. For him there is no longer any land of mystery. If there were he would not be content until he had mastered it.

Centuries of struggle with Nature on land and sea, and with men in every quarter of the earth have given the British an inheritance of racial and individual self confidence all the more remarkable because it is often concealed beneath a

heavy crust of reserve and surface self-deception. Beneath the crust in the milk of the United Kingdom and the Overseas one finds the pride of race and consciousness of his country that must have animated the Greek and the Roman in the days of their greatness. It is this pride of race which, after two and a half years of a tremendous conflict, sends men eagerly into the very heart of the inferno "to do their duty."

The matter-of-fact talk of the officers and men en route to the front might lead the casual hearer to suppose lack of imagination, or of knowledge as to what may be ahead. A gunner beside a big weapon or mounted astern, quivering from Kingsley's "Westward Ho!" He is a Londoner by birth, but knows and loves Devon, and her heroes. If a submarine should cross his path he will fight as Drake's men fought three centuries ago against all the devils of Spain.

Here is another type. He is a young Canadian, born in Edmonton of English parents. He never saw the sea till this morning. He never saw a vessel bigger than the little river steamer that ran on the Saskatchewan. Yet he comes aboard without the slightest perturbation. The salt sea air, the heaving water, his racial inheritance. It will take generations of the plains to make landmen of his breed and create in his descendants distrusts of the sea.

To many of the men of the western regiments on board the world is very small. One tells a story of Shanghai. Another talks with intimate knowledge of the Kafir problem in South Africa whether he went in 1899 to fight the Boers and where he lived long enough to respect them. Smuts and Botha are well known figures to him. Something turns the conversation to navigation and descriptions of ports in many lands are available. The man who knows all about the Straits of Magellan swaps experiences with the boatman from the Peace River. The rancher who got 128 bushels of oats per acre from part of his Alberta holding and secured sixty cents a bushel, gives short description on the absolute folly of permitting men to desert their holdings and their cattle when the Empire needs men so badly. Lots of them, he says, turned their live stock over to the buyer at any offered price, and left their places unoccupied.

The talk swings around to racial traits and we learn that the Japs in a coast battalion are good soldiers, but that the Scotch-Indian half breeds who bear proud Highland names have to be guarded all the time against fire-water which drives them crazy.

After an hour or two of attentive listening to smoking room talk, making his second trip over, after recovering from a serious wound, propounded the query: "Will the Empire settle down after this? Would everything be different?"

I had not suspected him of such speculations, but he, too, made a vulnerable point. He had gone to France two years ago with a very poor opinion of the Englishmen. They were, he fancied, surly, uncompanionable and lacked adap-
